1 Community Food Growing

An enclosed growing space for fruit, vegetables and flowers, close to the cafe. Come and learn how to grow or share your experience with others.



2 Entrance clearance

Here we will clear the non-native shrubs to open up the entrances to the growing space. Under the trees we will plant a carpet of spring bulbs as an early source of nectar for insects.



3 Nature trail

Pick up an activity sheet from the cafe and follow a nature trail through the woodland and grassy meadow. What can you see high up in the trees and low down on the ground?



4 Grassy meadow

Great for bees, bugs and butterflies! This meadow will provide a home for our pollinators to feed and shelter in. Paths will be mown through for access.

5 Woodland trees

Native trees planted in grassy meadows with bulb planting below. Their tree canopy will eventually link to the surrounding trees encouraging wildlife into our park.



6 Bird & bat boxes

Installed throughout the park, these nesting boxes will help our local bats and birds thrive.
