Background

Based on the consultation results from 2021 we have made changes (in green) based on this future plan. Orange ideas are being looked at now and blue ideas are future plans.

What we have achieved so far

- Entrance planting and flower meadows
- Moved railings to give more pavement room
- Planted bulbs for spring flowering
- Create a fenced wildlife pond area
- Kept areas of long grassland to attract wildlife
- Had community tree planting sessions

Medium term goals from 2022

- New Entrance Sign
- Planting larger trees around the entrance on Dorset Road and by the river
- Make the bridge over the river
- Make a wide shared path to the bridge over the by-pass
- A community art project to decorate the building
